Do this Do that...

This is a bit like Simon Says. The rules are, if the leader, says "Do this" (followed by an action) the rest of the group must copy. If the leader says "Do That" (followed by an action) the rest of the group must not do it. Anyone who copies a "Do that" action is out.

This can be followed by a discussion on different types of leadership.

Picture Copy

All young people are given a piece of A4 paper and a pencil/pen. One of the young people is shown a picture of an object (a house, smiley face, car, etc). The idea is that the leader must describe the picture to the rest of the group without saying what it is. They either must describe it line by line or in parts (draw a circle etc)

This could start a discussion on how we listen to the direction the Pope gives us. Do we take his comments out of context or without background information. Would the drawing have been easier if we knew what it was etc.

Each plays a Part

The aim of this game is for the group to complete a task, for example making a lunch. Each group member is asked to not use a part of their body, for example, no arms or legs or blindfolded or given music to listen so they cannot hear.

One member of the group is given the role of leader. It is their role to make sure that everybody is included and that the task is completed.

This could start a discussion on the Pope being the leader of the world wide church.
